The University of Bielsko-Biala was founded in October 2001 as an independent governmental academic institution. At present, about 5,000 students study at five faculties: Faculty of Mechanical Engineering and Computer Science; Faculty of Materials, Civil and Environmental Engineering; Faculty of Management and Transport; Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, and Faculty of Health Sciences. The University employs about 400 people, including 200 experienced professors and other academic staff. As the only state educational institution in the Podbeskidzie region which provides teritary education, the University of Bielsko-Biala has a vibrant community of ambitious individuals who contribute to the University's research and didactic potential by constantly attaining their professional, educational and social goals. The University is firmly rooted in the region which is reflected in various enterprises with members of the community and also in its research interests.

Briefing on the places to be visited during the International Week

Bielsko-Biała is a middle-sized (ca. 175 thousands of citizens) Polish city located at foothills of the mountain ranges of Beskid Śląski and Beskid Mały, in southern Poland, in the historical and cultural borderland of regions of Lesser Poland and Silesia. The river Biała which valley divides aforementioned mountain ranges used also for ages to divide two separate administrative entities of Bielsko (established in XIII century) and Biała (established as a city in 1723), before they were officially merged into one city, in 1951. Today, the city of Bielsko-Biała is a regional cultural and industrial centre, profiting from its picturesque and convenient location (close to the borders of Czechia and Slovakia, with Bratislava, Budapest, Vienna and Warsaw within a 400 km range) reinforced by well-developed road and railway connections. Although historically the source of the prosperity for both cities was the textile industry, the most developed branches here are now automotive, machine and IT.

Pszczyna is a town of medieval origins 20 km north from Bielsko-Biała, inhabited by ca. 25,5 thousands of people. From XV century to XX century it was a capital of a Duchy of Pszczyna, covering the town and nearby settlements. The last dynasty ruling there was the family of Hochberg von Pleß. The castle that they used to reside in and the adjacent Castle Park are currently the landmarks of the town, alongside the old town main square, neighbouring the castle from the other side. The town itself is located in an agricultural neighbourhood, close to the forest in the north and neighbouring a resort village Goczałkowice-Zdrój in the south.

Żywiec is a small city (ca. 30 thousands of people living there), located in the middle of Żywiec Basin, surrounded by the mountain ranges of Beskidy. Established at the turn of XIII and XIV centuries, Żywiec is a centre of distinct local culture.
